## Girl Spikers Set New Records

Five members of the Chemawa girls track team set six new school records during the 1971 season.

Lorean Driggs broke her own records in both the shotput and the discus. She put the shot 36' 5 $\frac{3}{4}$ " to better her old mark of 30' 11 $\frac{1}{4}$ ". She also threw the discus 104' 5 $\frac{3}{4}$ ", which beat her last year's mark of 98' 8".

Lorean took second in both the discus and shotput in the league championships, and was the only team member to compete in the district meet.

Patty Simpson set a new record in the javelin - 100' 2". The old record was 99' 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ " set by May Leavitt in 1969. Kathy Marchand and Kathy Andrews each lowered their own records in the 100 meter hurdles and the mile. The times were 18.5 and 6:21.7. Joanne Malemute broke Edith Williams' 880 record with a time of 2:49.7.

The team voted the Most Outstanding Performer award to Kathy Andrews and Lorean Driggs. Kathy Marchand won the Go-Getter award.
