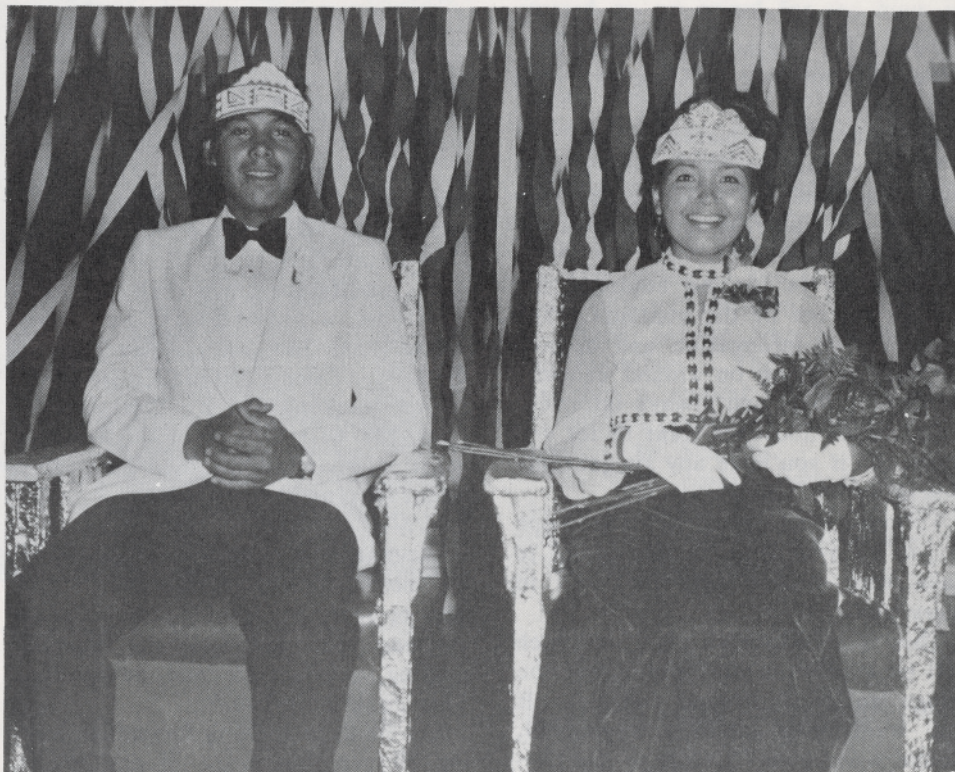
Student groups and clubs who want to use the Center can do so by reserving it in advance of the date wanted.
