Runners Take District For Fifth Straight Year

The Varsity Cross-Country Team won the District Championship for the fifth straight year. Chemawa has not lost a Capital Conference dual meet in more than five years.

The Braves are currently ranked as the third best AA team in the state, behind defending champion Madras and Sapoose.

Del Okbaok, Jacob Merculief, and Art Ambrose became the 2nd, 3rd, and 4th Chemawa runners to break 13 minutes on the 2½-mile home course. Leonard Huntington still holds the record of 12:25, which he set in 1969.

"At the beginning of the year," Coach Kugie Louis said, "it was doubtful this team would be as strong as the teams in the past, but surprisingly they have developed into the most outstanding team in the history of our school."

Harold Fairbanks is the only Senior. Joe Peters, a Junior, was added to the team for the State meet. Okbaok, Ambrose, Huntington, Fairbanks, and Peters are veterans of last year's District Champion team which finished second in the State Meet behind Madras.

Coach Louis predicted that the Braves will finish in the Top Three at State again this year and probably will take the state title in 1972.

The following boys ran for the Junior Varsity team: Adolph Lupie, Ray Koonuk, Robert Lake, Herman Evan, Henry Alexie, James Soloman, and Eddie Biederman. There was no Junior Varsity District Championship, but the Brave's JV's never lost a dual meet.
