The Chemawa cross-country team completed their fifth straight undefeated league season and captured their fifth straight Capital Conference championship at Bush Park in Salem October 27.

The Braves set a new conference scoring record at the conference championships by winning six of the top seven spots for an amazingly low total of 19 points. (Low score wins in cross-country.) Woodburn finished second with 63 and Cascade third with 73.

Rube Sanders Honored by Indian Hall of Fame

The late Rube Sanders, father-in-law of Chemawa English teacher, Mrs. Ethelmae Sanders, will be inducted into the Indian Hall of Fame at Haskell Institute on November 25. His widow, Mrs. Augusta Sanders, will travel to Haskell to accept the plaque honoring him.

While attending Chemawa Indian School, Rube Sanders played football, basketball and participated in track. He was also an outstanding football player at Stanford and Willamette Universities.

After graduating in 1900, Sanders worked at Chemawa as a printing instructor and track coach. He retired in 1937 and died in 1954.
