

Chemawa to Join Nat. Honor Soc.

Chemawa will soon be joining the National Honor Society, but students who want to become members will discover that it is one of the toughest organizations in the country to join.

National Honor Society is an organization whose purpose is to honor student leadership, character and most of all, scholastic ability.

This is a nationwide organization, with chapters all over the country. Mrs. Alice Anderson will serve as adviser to the Chemawa chapter.

To qualify for membership, a student must be a junior or senior with a cumulative grade point average of 3.5 or better. A sophomore may be elected during the last grading period of the year.

Character, leadership and civic responsibility also determine whether or not one is elected to National Honor Society.

"We have applied for our charter and are waiting for the corrected honor roll to come out," said Mrs. Anderson when asked how long it would be before Chemawa has any members in the society.

"It's good to know that we are eligible," added Principal Choctaw Smith. "We have been accredited as a school by the Oregon and Northwest Accrediting Associations, and this gives us our eligibility."

Officers will be chosen as soon as a membership can be established from students eligible.
