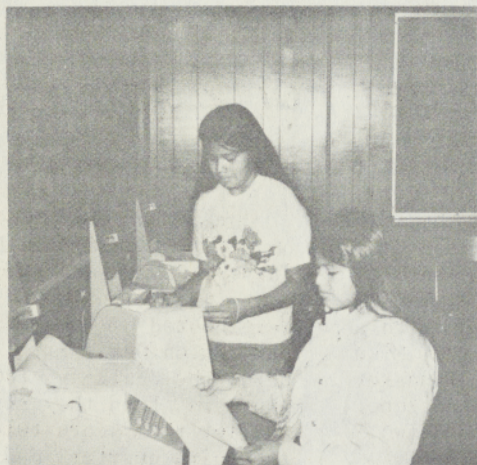

Title-I Provides Computer Classes

Since April 1975 students at Chemawa Indian School with academic problems in the Basic Skill Areas of Reading, Language Arts and Mathematics have been using Computer Assisted Instruction (C.A.I.) to reduce their academic deficiencies. Chemawa's C.A.I. Title I Project provides 16 computer terminals for student use on campus. Students are selected for the C.A.I. program by the magnitude of academic deficiencies. Those students with the greatest need get 50 minutes of work on C.A.I. each week in the area of academic deficiency. C.A.I. work is structured so that each student gets an individualized program that is selected by the computer on the basis of performance. The student must make enough correct answers to indicate that he has the background necessary in a C.A.I. course before advancement to the next part of the program of study.
