Funds Approved for Next Year

According to Bob Henselman, Title I Coordinator at Chemawa Indian School, the Chemawa Computer Assisted Instruction Project has been funded for another fiscal year. Mr. Henselman says that he expects to receive \$115,581.00 to provide services for about 250 target students next fiscal year.

Henselman said that the project's goal continues to be to double the academic gain of target students in the Basic Skill Areas of Reading, Language Arts and Math. According to Mr. Henselman the Computer Assisted Instruction project will also provide services to target students in the Basic Skill Areas during the 1976 Summer School.

Summer School Planned

Yes, there's going to be a summer school this year for those who are interested. It's going to start June 7, and ends July 30.

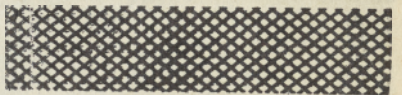
They are going to have six classes, five of them are going to be required classes. It's going to be 8:00 a.m. to 3.00 p.m.
