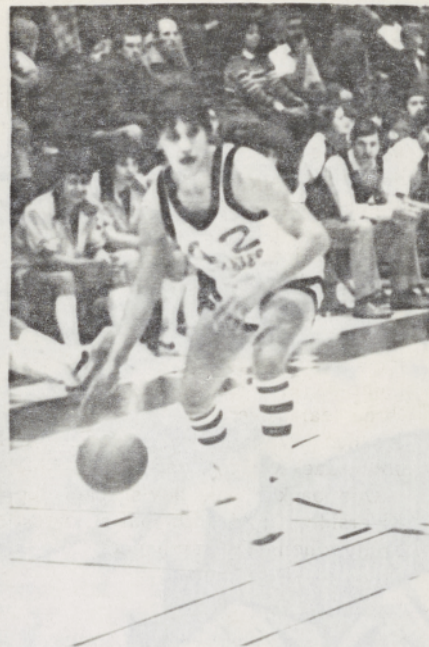
After an initial defeat (60-41) in a game against St. Paul, the Chemawa 9th team have had a series of rousing victories as follows:
