Our basket ball boy's team topped Riverside, and Chemawa wrestlers brought home the mat honors.

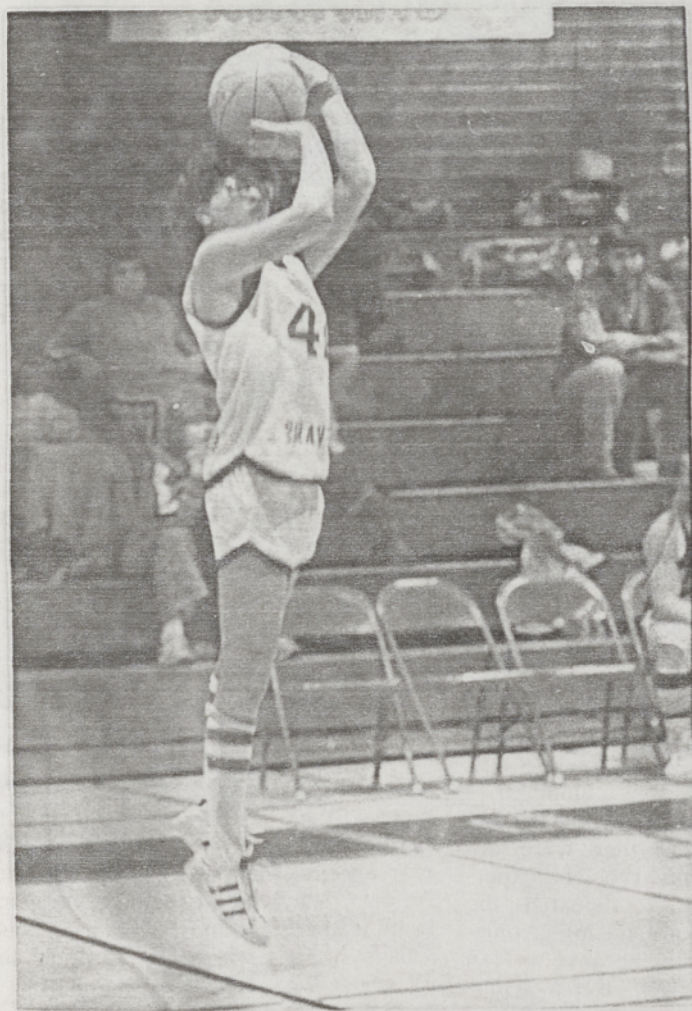
CHEMAWA VS MCKAY
