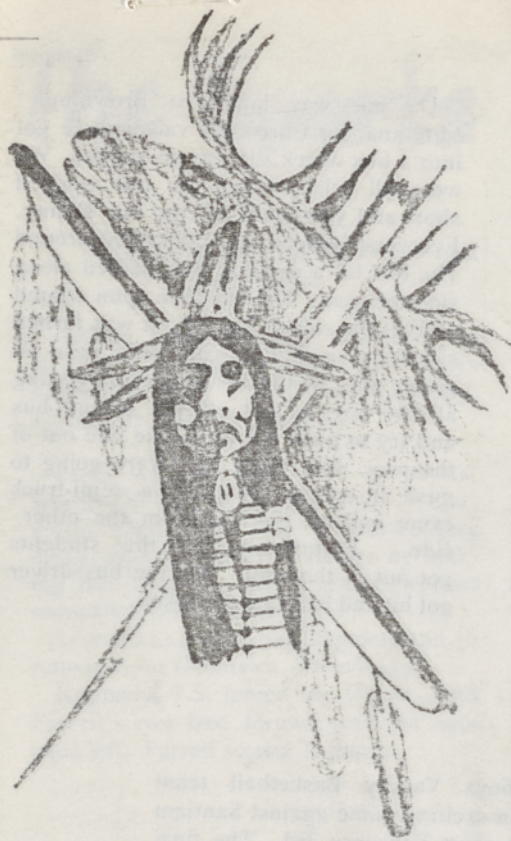
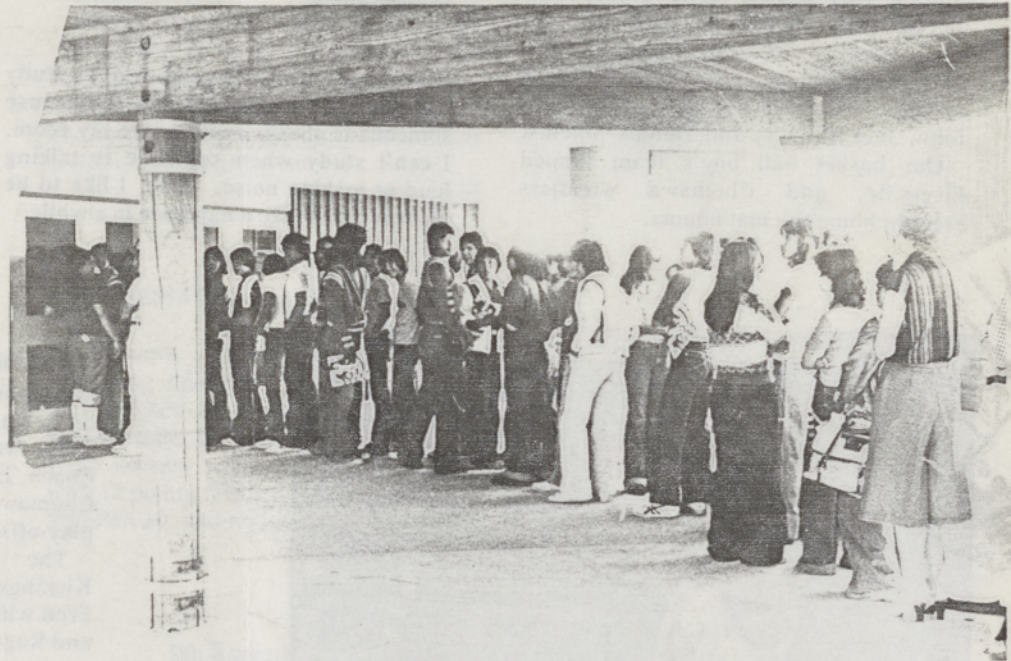


Second Quarter Honor Roll
