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commander of the rescue, ship Carpathia Captain Arthur H. Rostron became one of the principal figures in the Titanic tragedy. On receiving the wireless call from the sinking vessel he changed his course and ordered full speed for the scene of the disaster. The Carpathia made the fifty-eight miles to the Titanic in three and one-half hours. After the survivors had been taken aboard the ship Captain Rostron ordered a thanksgiving service, meanwhile maneuvering the Carpathia among the wreckage in the hope of picking up other survivors, but without success. He has followed the sea for twenty-seven years and has been with the Cunard line since 1895 He has been in command of the Carpathia for only a few months. Captain Rostron appeared before the senate investigating committee and told at length the story of the rescue.
