

A SMUGGLER ARRESTED

Judge Langley, of San Antonio, Arrested for Running Horses From Mexico into the United States.

The Dead at Martinique Will Number About 250--Macon, Mo., Ruined by Heavy Rains.

SAN ANTONIO, TEX., Aug. 21.—Judge Roy Nolan Langley has been arrested for smuggling from Mexico. It is alleged he has been concerned in running horses from Mexico into the United States.

BLOWN TO PIECES.

An Explosion in New York Causes the Death of Fully Fifty People—No Time to Escape. Two Buildings Totally Demolished--The Ruins Burning Fiercely--The Work of Rescue.

NEW YORK, Aug. 22.—One of the worst disasters which ever happened in this city occurred just after noon today. From what can now be learned fully 50 not more than fifty people lost their lives in order that the work of rescue and burial of the dead may be hastened. The explosion occurred at No. 81 Park Place, a building at No. 81 Park Place, who was directly across the street when the accident occurred said he was standing on the steps at No. 81 Park Place at noon when he heard the sound of an explosion from across the street, and almost immediately the front of the building collapsed, and the entire building caved in with a deafening crash.
