The coming marriage of Prince Ferinand of Bulgaria and Princess Marie Louise of Bourbon excites much interest abroad. The princess, who in all probability will be a queen some day, recently celebrated the twentythird anniversary of her birth. She is the eldest daughter of the duke of Parma, who, with his family, has lived at Schloss Schwarzau, in Lower Austria, for the last four years. The Alabama Statesman Who Is Now Secretary of the Navy.

Hon, Hilary A. Herbert, of Alabama. was born at Laurensville, Ala. When a child his father moved to Greenville Butler county. Ala. He was coluente. at the University of Alabama and the University of Virginia, studied law and was admitted to the bar. He entered the confederate service as captain and

was in a short time promoted to the colonelcy of the Eighth Alabama volunteers. He was wounded at the battle of the Wilderness in 1864. After the war he resumed the practice of law at Greenville, Ala., until 1572, when he moved to Montgomery, where he has since practiced. He was elected to the Forty-fifth, Forty-sixth, Forty-seventh, Forty-eighth, Forty-ninth, and Fifty-first congresses and reelected to the Fifty-second congress as a demoerat, receiving 10,611 votes, against 2,-681 votes for S. A. Pillary, independent. Mr. Herbert has twice been chairman

of the house naval committee, and is well fitted to administer the office of secretary of the navy.


