Unmerciful Disaster.

Press advices by steamer from South Africa contain a story of an extraordinary series of fatalities that occured near Johannesburg, and whereby a prominent resident lost his entire family in the space of a few minutes.

Three of his children, aged respectively 8, 10 and 12 years, left the family farmhouse to go to their tather, who was in a field about half a mile distant. On the way each of the three put their hand in a crevice of a rock for the purpose of searching for birds' eggs. The crevice, however, happened to have been taken possession ot by a deadly snake, and each of the children was bitten before it could withdraw its hand.
