This Is Why Thurston's Recall Was Asked by Gresham.

WASHINGTON, March 23.—The precise complaint which was forwarded to the Hawaiian government, in the customary manner through Willis, upon which Mr. Thurston's recall is requested, stated that he had made statements to the press reflecting upon the American minister at Honolulu, and intended to discredit him and impair his usefulness.

The complaint that Thurston had published official matters before communicating them to the state department, was considered of secondary importance, though the administration regarded it as strange that he should have officially confirmed the report that the schooner Walberg had cleared from San Francisco to land 1000 stands of arms, of which the Hawaiian government had captured only 300.

They May All be Lynched.

BIRMINGHAM, Ala., March 25.—Isaac Tankersly, Isham Falls, negroes, are in jail here charged with a brutal attack upon Mr. and Mrs. John Barr Saturday night. There is intense excitement and some talk of lynching. Barr, who has a store at Tuscaloosa, was returning home at night with his wife, having in his pocket the proceeds of the days' sales.

Examining Chang's Account.

NEW YORK, March 23.—The Herald's correspondent at Shanghai says: "Experts are at present engaged in the task of overhauling Li Hung Chang's accounts at Tien-Tsin. They have found a record of the purchase of 7,000,000 rifles, and, as these are supposed to be of the latest pattern, it is hard to explain the striking insufficiency of the modern rifles in the Chinese army, except on the hypothesis that the viceroy, like his son-in-law, Chang, has been guilty of peculation."

Unmerciful Disaster.

Press advices by steamer from South Africa contain a story of an extraordinary series of fatalities that occurred near Johannesburg, and whereby a prominent resident lost his entire family in the space of a few minutes.

Three of his children, aged respectively 8, 10 and 12 years, left the family farmhouse to go to their father, who was in a field about half a mile distant. On the way each of the three put their hand in a crevice of a rock for the purpose of searching for birds' eggs. The crevice, however, happened to have been taken possession of by a deadly snake, and each of the children was bitten before it could withdraw its hand. Two died almost immediately, while the third man-to-crawl back to the house and raise an alarm.

The mother, frantic with grief, mounted a horse, with a view of going for help. She placed the child in front of her, but forgot to securely fasten it, and she had hardly gotten out of the yard when it fell over to the ground, sustaining a fracture of the skull which caused instant death. The mother re-entered the house with the body, only to find that within a few moments her fourth and youngest child had been drowned by falling into a cistern.

The mother is now down with brain fever, and the original family of six there is only the father to tell the remarkable story.
