

Victorious Spaniards.

SANTIAGO DE CUBA, April 20.—Colonel Santocildes reports from Manzanillo, where he is in command, that April 8 he sent out 900 troops in three columns to San Vincente, to search for insurgents. At Punta Gorda they encountered and put to flight a small party. The fight lasted but a few minutes. The insurgents lost three killed, all their horses and most of their arms. April 9 the same troops defeated the insurgents at Sabanagna. Three insurgents were killed and one Spanish soldier was wounded. Two days later a party of soldiers, who were scouting near Bodega Chinos, came upon a large band. They killed four of the insurgents and put the rest to flight, losing only two men wounded. Later on in the day, the same troops overtook another band at Santa Lucena. The fight was shorter, and almost bloodless. It ended with the defeat of the insurgents and the capture of their arms, horses and provisions by the Spanish force.

Hydrophobia Developed From the Bite of a Cat.

TALLAHASSEE, Fla., April 22.—Henry, the 12-year-old son of Chief of Police Benruter, of this city, developed decided symptoms of hydrophobia yesterday and last night his life was despaired of. Six weeks ago, while Henry and a younger brother were visiting relatives in Jacksonville, the latter was attacked by a large black cat. Henry went to help his brother, and was terribly scratched and bitten on his face and hands by the cat. The injuries were cauterized, and the boy seemed in his usual health until yesterday. While playing in the yard with other children the boy began to act strangely, and manifested a disposition to scratch his playmates. His parents were called, and when they appeared Henry ran to them, mewing like a cat. He was seized and confined and doctors summoned, but they have not been able to relieve the child. At times he would become quiet and purr and mew. Then a violent paroxysm seizes him and he acts like an enraged cat and uses his fingers as claws. His case is considered hopeless.

Gold Mines Jealously Guarded by the Natives.

SAN LUIS POTOSI, Mexico, April 22.—C. L. Debenroth, the mining man who left here six months ago on a trip through the territory of Tepece, in search of the fabulously rich gold mines that are said to be worked there by the Indians, was killed in the mountains near one of the Indian villages.
