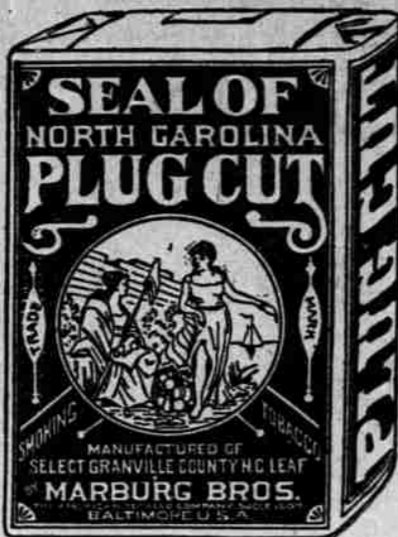


RUSSIAN ROYALTY.

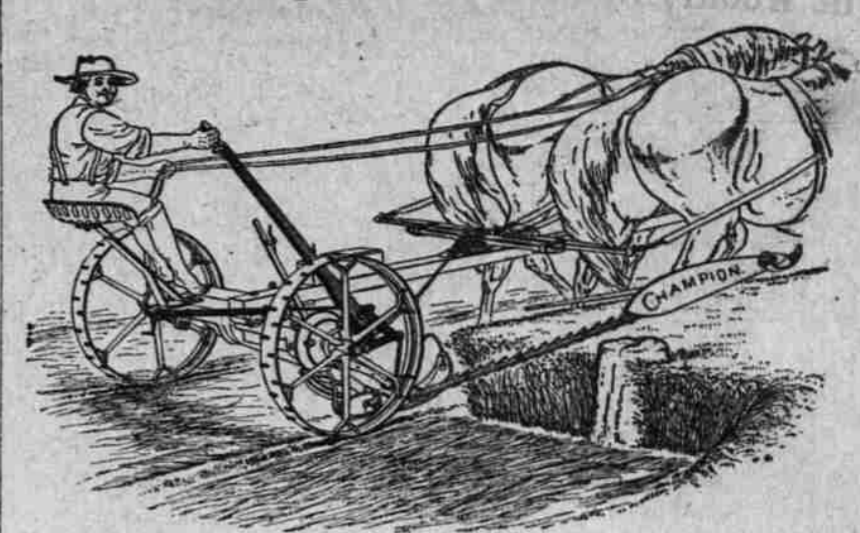
