#### A County Jail Mystery.

The sheriff's office was thrown into a mild degree of excitement last night when the following letter was sent to Sheriff Driver from inside the jail. The doctor referred to is undoubtedly meant for Dr. Rothermal, who was recently 8 40 released on bonds from the county jail:

MR. TOM DRIVER: DEAR SIR:-I am sure it is my duty, under the circumstances, to inform you of what is going on in this jail. The Chinaman has in some way got hold of some small tablets or pills, and I be-lieve them to be poison. He told me he was going to kill himself, and last night I saw him hiding those pills about his clothes and bed. I saw him put some 54 of them in his hat, under the sweatband, and he put some more of them in 2 10 his bed. Mahaffy said he saw the doc-1 05 tor give them to him, and said the doctor said it was morphine; and he also said 1 05 the doctor told him not to say anything, as he said he was only doing it to get even on you. Now, Tom, I think you had best come right in and make search as soon as possible, for I think this stuff is poison of some kind, and have every reason to believe the China-man will use it. I remain

Acting upon the suggestion made in 26 50 the letter, the sheriff searched the Chinaman, Harry, who is confined in jail for the China murder last summer, and found several lots of morphine upon his person. The Chinaman professed ignorance at their being there, and said 9 45 he never used the drug, but claimed 10 50 that Douglas told him to be careful about eating his soup, as there might be poison in it. The whole affair is very 5 25 mysterious, but Sheriff Driver gives an 16 00 explanation which is very different 3 80 from the idea conveyed by the letter. Mr. Driver savs the Chine man told him Dora Houston,
Plaintiff the inmates of the jail were preparing for an outbreak, and that this fact becoming known to the prisoners, some of To Volney J. Houston, the defendant above

them determined to give the Chinaman a dose of morphine and get him out of the way, at the same time leaving the impression that he committed spicide. Extra precautions have been taken by Sheriff Driver, Deputy Kelly and Jailer Fitzgerald, and the cells have been thoroughly searched. No one with the key is allowed to enter the jail alone, for fear the prisoners would overpower him

and make a break for liberty.

The matter was laid before Deputy Prosecuting Attorney Phelps, who did not deem it advisable for any warrant to be issued for the one bringing the morphine into the jail.


