The Hay-Burning Case

The case of the State vs. Thomas Lewis, charged with setting fire to the haystacks of Phillip Brogan, occupied the attention of the circuit court today. The case is of the greatest importance as there have been several of these deeds perpetrated, and this is one of the first attempts at conviction. The evidence against Lewis is circumstantial, consisting of evidence to the effect that tracks supposed to be Lewis' were found to lead to the stack and away from it. Mr. Brogan has employed A. F. Sears, Jr., to assist the prosecuting attorney while Huntington & Wilson are employed for the defense. The time yesterday and a portion of this morning were spent in examining witnesses. A large portion of Antelope's population has appeared as witnesses. For the prosecution
