CHICAGO, July 11 .- A caucus of the delegates adjourned at 2:30 o'clock this morning without naming a candidate for vice-president. The convention was called to order at 11 a.m. Harrity of of the National Committee would be held at 3 p. m. Very few gold delegates are present today.
