HE DIED GAME.

Execution Witnessed by a Big Crowd at Hillsboro.

WACHLINE'S LAST WORDS. HILLSBORO, Feb. 4 .- "I die an innocent man. The sworn statement I made was true. May the Lord Jesus Christ take me."

HILLSBORD, Feb. 4 .- Gus Wachline was hanged in the county court yard at 12:15 today.

Fully five hundred people witnessed the inflicting of the death penalty on the hardened murderer.

The crime for which the condemned murderer paid the death penalty was the killing of John D, Ledrick, a German farmer, who lived near Cornelius, in Washington county, April 13, 1895. It was one of the most atrocious murders ever committed in the state.

Wachline met his fate unflinchingly. On the gallows he spoke a few words of farewell which were not heard by a dozen spectators. He stolidly proclaimed his innocence in his last moments. He kept his eyes on the ground. Not once did he look into the eager crowd around him for the face of friend or foe in the small inclosure surrounding the death trap. With his head bowed, the black cap was pulled down over his face, and like a statue the doomed man awaited York. the end.
