NEWS NOTES.

The steamer Oregon arrived in Portland last night.

Spain has appointed a new minister to Washington.

Reports received from Dyea and Skagway state that soldiers are badly needed at those places. Troughs have charge of the towns.

A big fire occurred at San Francisco yesterday. The Phelan block was badly damaged and several hundred thousand dollars worth of property destroyed.

Semi-official advices received by the French foreign office from Peking say Japan has notified China that she intends keeping Wei-Hal-Wei permanently.

Senor Sagasta, the premier, and other members of the Spanish cabinet, state publicly that the De Lome incident will not effect the relations between Spain and the United States, and that a new

The Oregon delegation in congress expects to get favorable action from the war department for the Yaquina bay improvement, which means the expenditure of about one million dollars at that place.

Spain has not yet apologized for the De Lome letter.

Two burglars who have been operating in Portland for some time were captured last night.

The steamer Oregon sailed for Alaska last night with a full cargo of passengers and freight.

Another rich find it reported on Copper river. It is said that the place is studded with gold.

It was rumored Sunday that Consul-General Lee has resigned, but no definite information was obtainable.

Jacob Combs fell three hundred feet down a shaft at the Maryland mine yesterday and was instantly killed.

A secret dispatch was received from Minister Woodford yesterday. The supposition is that it was a report of the action of the Spanish government in the De Lome matter.

The Democrats and Populists in Portland are greatly aroused over the appointment of judges and clerks by the county court. They pronounce it biased and outrageous.

The Hawaiian annexation treaty will receive the greater share of the senate's attention during the week.

Latest advices state that Zola's chances for acquittal are slim, but it is expected that his punishment will be light.

England is negotiating with China to open Yung Chuu Fu, in the province of Hun Nan, as a treaty port, and is negotiating also on the subject of the navigation of inland waters.

The house will on Wednesday enter upon the consideration of the bankruptcy bill, which the majority of the judiciary committee reported as a substitute for the Nelson bill, passed by the senate at an extra session last summer.

The 13th annual meeting of the National Woman's Suffrage Association began at Washington yesterday afternoon. The meeting also signalized the 50th anniversary of the first convention of women devoted to woman's rights in this country.

The Hong Kong Telegraph says that continual trouble is being reported from vessels manned by Japanese crews, the Japanese resenting any instructions or surveillance from European officers, and showing an especial aversion for European passengers.

A big colonization project is being considered at present by the Japanese. It being to send a colony of the Mikado's subjects to Mexico to engage in raising coffee. An immense land grant is said to have been obtained from the Mexican government.

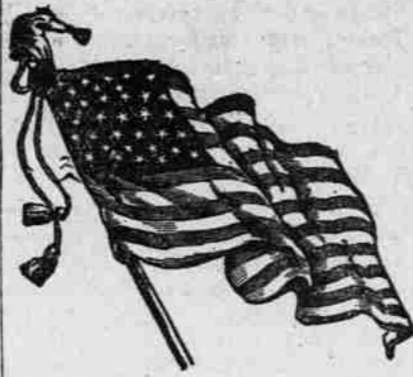

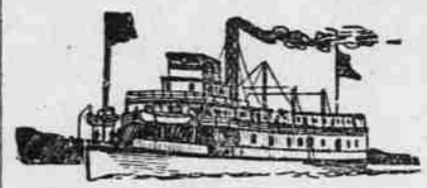
