The Day in the Senate. WASHINGTON, Feb. 24 .- At the opening of today's session of the senate, the chaplin prayed that in this momentous hour of our history the blessing of the Holy Spirit might rest on the president and vice-president of the United States, both branches of congress and all the people of the country. He prayed that the honor and dignity and rights of our country might be upheld.
