

BOMBARDMENT OF SAN JUAN

Only One American Killed--Morro Fort the Principal Object of Attack--The Forts Badly Damaged.

KEY WEST, May 18.—The newspaper dispatch boat has arrived today bringing details of the bombardment of San Juan May 12th.

The fleet appeared off San Juan at daylight, and the people in the town fled in terror.

The ships did not enter the entrance to the harbor, but remained in front of Morro castle and Fort San Cristobal.

Morro Fort was the chief object of the attack and a storm of shells poured into it.

The Spaniards must have suffered heavy losses, but fought bravely.

Morro and the other defenses were badly damaged, as officers through their glasses could see men, rock and earth go up into the air as the shots struck the fort.
