An Inexhaustible Supply of Pure Sulphate in Wyoming.

New Industry That Promises to Make the American Market Independent of Foreign

By the opening up of the vast natural soda deposits of Wyoming another industry is to be added to the rapidly growing list in which the United States can outstrip the world. Nature's laboratory, which is working underground, and without a pay roll, is turning out an inexhaustible supply of pure sulphate of soda which is he base of a large number of by-products that are used in one form or another in almost every sort of manufacture and in every household in civilization. Nature's product is one stage nearer the point of consumption than is the manufactured article. Over 70 per cent, of the latter consumed in this country is imported and practically all of the remaining 30 per cent, is made in factories that are branches of the foreign establishments. The quantity thus far taken from the deposits is no sufficient to supply a small fraction of the glass makers of the Indiana gas belt alone, though the latter can use it at an immense saving over the manufactured and can turn out a better quality of glass. The elimination of the expensive processes of manufacture puts the native soda in a position not only to command the American markets, but ultimately to pay for exporting it to the very countries from which the American supply is now com ing. Despite the fact that only a beginning has been made on the home trade there is every indication that its rise from an infant industry to a point where it can command the world will be very rapid. To accomplish this recult the native soda must supplant the 400,000 tons of soda ash used by the window and plate glass makers of this country each year, and then take care der and match manufacturers, and also the tanners, bleachers, woolen mill men, dyers, packers, printers, photographers, starch makers and a host of other users outside of the medicinal. three lakes or beds lying 14 miles southwest of Laramie, and which comprise the bulk of the deposits, in workable quantities, of the state. 


