Five Killed, Twenty-Five Wounded is 'Phone 341. Our Total List of Casualties.

Manua, Jone 19 .- A batallion of the Fourth infantry, which left Imus with General Wheaton in command this morning to recommenter toward Pedas Desmarm, was attacked in the rear by apparently friendly natives. This brought on a charp engagement lasting killed and twenty-five wounded. The loss of the rebels was very heavy.

The batallion soon exhausted its ammunition and Wheaten and his staff with two mountain guns and one field piece went to reinforce the troops which were attacked. General Wheaton was fired on in the road and had a narrow

The third battalion was ordered to the front and formed on the Las Minas road. Heavy firing on both sides followed, artillery being freely used. The enemy was located in the woods at 4 o'clock, showing signs of retiring as the rebels were pressed very hard. One gun of the Sixth artillery did great execution.

The fighting was still in progress at 5 clock, at which time the Americans had secured a quantity of Filipino arms which had been abandoned in the woods. The ecene of the fighting is 20 miles from Manila.

Offered a Regiment.

WASHINGTON, June 19 .- The war department today received a telegram signed by Senators Perkins and White offering for immediate service in the Philippines a full regiment of infantry from Southern California. No action can be taken in thematter. The question of calling for volunteers has not been determined, besides it has not been decided whether state troops would be accepted, should volunteers be called for.
