All these conditions enhance the prosperity which has come with our increasing foreign markets. Indeed, they have created a situation which makes it impossible to fully supply the home demand in a number of articles, iron and steel being most prominent. The vast sums of money put into circulation create building booms by capitalists who find themselves with more cash on hand than they can loan. The necessity for borrowing is reduced because the manufacturer and the business man do business more nearly on a cash

Eventually this money must come out of the pockets of the people through taxation, but it is not improbable that gain accruing from the impetus given all manner of industry will more than offset the losses and the burdens entailed. Certain it is that the entire nation has about outgrown the period of overproduction and the distress of a few years ago. If the foreign trade continues to grow there will be work in plenty for the soldier of today who comes back next year to take up the broken threads of civilian existence.
