Downger Empress Is Believed to Have Forced Old One to Abdicate and Nine-Year-Old Boy Will Succeed

PERING, Jan. 25.-The imperial edict ssued yesterday says that owing to the emperor's poor health he is unable to conduct the business of the state, and appoints Put Sing, son of Prince Tuano, his heir. The emperor apparently has been compelled by the dowager empress to abdicate about Chinese New Year, though it is understood this will meet with considerable opposition in certain court circles. The dowager empress, however, intends to carry out the programme which she had been planning for years.

Washington, Jan. 25 .- The Chinese minister here has received no official information as to the appointment of a new emperor. When the announcement was shown the members of the legation by a representative of the Associated Press, considerable surprise was expressed from the fact that the names mentioned, Put Sing, the reported new emperor, and Prince Tuano, his father, are not known to any member of the legation. 
