## EXPECTS THEM TO COME BACK

Believes When Eastern Gold Democrats Understand the Chicago Platform They Will All Vote and Work for It.

NEW YORK, Jan. 29 .- A special to the Herald from Washington says: William J. Bryan spent a quiet Sunday in this city and left in the evening for Providence, via New York, Mr. Bryan's visit to Providence will be his second entry into New England, and while he does not, of course, look for substantial results from that section, he believes the indications from his Eastern reception will be of value to the party throughout

"I have been greatly pleased," he said, "at the interest manifested by Democrats of the East in what I have had to say upon the great issues before the people. There is every indication of the return of every man, who, misunderstanding the issues of the last campaign, went off to the enemy, and I believe that as the real meaning of the principals of the Chicago platform are better understood by the people of the East, not only will we regain the Democrate, but we will also make rerious inroads in the ranks of our opponents."

Mr. Bryan does not believe that the Republicans will hold out the hope of international bimetallism in their platform of 1900. He expects to see their platform declare unequivocally for the gold standard.
