Call for Republican County Convention.

Time for Holding Primaries.

The Republican County Convention of Wasco County, State of Oregon, is hereby called to meet in Dalles City, in said county, on Friday March 23, 1900, at the hour of 10 o'clock a. m. of said day, for the purpose of nominating candidates for the following county officers: county judge, county clerk, county sheriff, county treasurer, one county commissioner, county assessor, county school superintendent, county coroner, and county surveyor, also precinct officers for the several precincts of said county; and 10 delegates to the Republican State and District Congressional Conventions, and to transact such other business as may properly come before said County Convention. The convention will consist of 100 delegates chosen by the several precincts, and the several precincts of said county will be entitled to representation in said convention as follows:

In East Dalles precinct the polls for said primary election will be located at the East End Hose Co.'s house, and H. Rice, C. E. Chrisman and L. S. Davis will act as judges at said election; in Bigelow precinct the polls will be located at the office of Wm. Michell, and J. M. Patterson, F. Faulkner and Wm. Michell will act as judges at said election; in Trevitt precinct the polls will be located at the northeast corner of Third and Union streets, and F. J. Sampson, Frank Vogt and J. Fisher will act as judges at said election; and in West Dalles precinct the polls will be located at the City Mills, and C. L. Schmidt, J. F. Staniels and C. M. Fouts will act as judges at said election.

The polls in each of said precincts, in said primary election, will be kept open from 12 o'clock noon to 7 o'clock p. m. for the reception of votes. The polls in each of the other precincts in the county will be located in the usual voting places in each precinct, and it is recommended shall be opened at the hour of 2 o'clock p. m. on said 17th day of March, 1900, and will be conducted in the usual manner.
