The board which Gen. Otis recently convened to devise forms of municipal government has submitted his report, which is now in General Otis' hands. It is probable, however, that this report will not be promulgated until after the arrival of the Philippine commission. General Otis considers the general situation satisfactory. Although many Americans have been captured here and there by the insurgents, this year, their capture was largely due to their own carelessness.

The American troops are constantly catching thieves, scattering guerrilla bands and capturing rifles. Many here believe that the time is ripe for the introduction of severe methods in dealing with recalcitrant natives.
