# **EMPRESS DOWAGER HOLDS REIGNS**

Romor That Legations at Pekin Were Safe on Thursday Last-Ministers and Foreigners Will Hold Out Until Rescued.

SHANGHAL, July 10 .- News from official scurces was received at 10 o'clock last night to the effect that the empress had June 30 resumed the rains of governminister. It is said that she sent a dispatch to Nankin by courier route at the rate of one hundred miles per day, thanking the Viceroys of the Yangtse Kiang provinces for their loyalty, and recommending that they protect foreigners at any cost.

"Mr. Odell's report causes great alarm among the president's close friends and advisors. Mr. Odell made it plain that he regarded the plot as a matter of the utmost seriousness, and urged that extreme precautions be taken to keep the President out of harm's reach.
