The trusts know no party. Democrats, populists, Bryanites, republicans, all and equally are in them to make money, for trusts are organized to make money and for no other purpose. No one blames Bryan for assaulting combinations of capital whose operations are detrimental to the interests of the masses. The blame lies in his hypocritical and utterly false pretension that only republicans are responsible for their existence or have the selfishness to be connected with them. As an honest, candid fact there is no party which sustains or looks with tolerance upon any conspiracy to monopolize trade, to destroy competition or artificially to fix the prices of raw material on the one hand and finished products on the other. There is no party that has aught but antagonism to conspiracies of greed against need—conspiracies which, as the democratic platform truly enough declares, "rob both producer and consumer." Certainly the republican party holds no brief for any such clients as these. If this were all that Bryan means by his denunciation of trusts, there could be no issue on that subject between him and republicans.

Yesterday at Huntington, W. Va., Bryan attempted to answer the republican dinner pail argument by saying that "Esau sold his birthright for a full dinner pail." Mr. Bryan is mistaken. Esau sold his "mess," and a mess of vegetable soup at that; and the working people of this country had all they want of that kind of truck four years ago.
