96,000 Acres Picked up on Vancouver Island.

Portland timbermen have just completed the largest deal in Pacific chast timber hands of the year, about 30,000 acres of it, spruce, cedar and bemlock timber on Vancouver Island, the consideration being in the neighborhood of \$800,000. The tract was porchased by J. D. Lacey & Co., for southern clients who comprise a syndicate headed by Buchner, Banks & Edigar, of Arkansas. The tract is one of the largest of consolidated timber lands north of the British Columbia boundary.


