After the evening sermon a large number of men and women rose at the evangelist's appeal, and in an after meeting two young men came squarely out for the Christian life. Both Mr. Driver's sermons were masterpieces, and were delivered with telling effect. The meetings will continue this week with meetings at three and at 7:30 p. m., each day.

Attorney Buchanan is represented by Attorney Albert Abraham, while Attorney A. N. Orcutt is looking after the interests of Mrs. Kennett.
