### AGED FARMER DIES

SALEM, Dec. 2.—John Slough, the aged farmer who was found in the road Tuesday in a precarious condition as the result of exhaustion caused by the long tramp of five miles and back from the Fruitland to Salem in the severe storm of last Monday, died at the Salem hospital without recovering consciousness. Slough was found on a bridge about half a mile from his home, where it appeared he had dragged himself painfully, finally falling on a roller for a towel rack he carried. The fall battered his left cheek bone, causing a serious wound. He had laid on the bridge all night before he was found.
