A representative of the Sparrow-Kroll Lumber Co., of Michigan, arrived here this morning to spend two weeks looking after the interests of the firm in this vicinity. He says his people have practically abandoned their lumber business in Michigan and are now looking toward Oregon. They intend to purchase considerable timber on Smith river in Coos county as well as in other sections of the state.

While at Coquille City a few days since Horace Marsters of the Farmers Real Estate Company, succeeded in forming a corporation known as the Coquille-Coos Coal Company. The incorporators are A. C. Marsters, Horace Marsters, E. M. Furman and J. W. Toolman. The company has secured about 800 acres of coal producing land in the vicinity of Coquille City and expect to work the property at an early date. They estimate the output of 4,000,000 tons of the product from the property without serious difficulty.
