A marriage license was issued to John L. Row and Agnes Haines, both residents of Douglas county.

At a special election held Saturday road district No. 44 voted a 3 mill levy for road purposes.

Attorney A. N. Orcutt leaves for Salem this evening to argue a case before the Supreme Court.

County Judge Wnocott has received word to the effect that road district No. 31, comprising a part of the Days Creek section, has levied a special tax levy of 3 mills, the same to be used in improving the roads.

Constable Wright and Sheriff Fenton visited the soft drink emporium, conducted by W. A. Bogard, and situated at the corner of Sess and Sheridan streets, Saturday evening, and after brief investigating confiscated several bottles, purported to contain "near beer."

When they went to obtain the rigs Saturday afternoon they were apprised that they had been taken by other parties who alleged that they were the parties who ordered the conveyances.

Investigation revealed the fact that a number of citizens opposed to the tax had obtained the rigs, presumably of the opinion that the "progressives" would be unable to reach the polls. Such was not the case, however, other vehicles having been hired without delay.

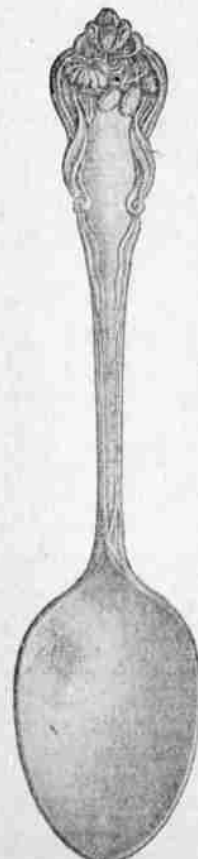
