TAKING OF TESTIMONY

Shepherd, Yamhill county, and H. G. Starkweather, school teacher, Milwaukie, Clackamas county. Henry Excuses Two.

Only two of the three pre-emptory challenges, available to the government, were employed, the jurors excused by Mr. Heney in this manner being Green Hale, a retired farmer, Portland, and John C. Paulson, painter, Portland. Nine other jurors were excused by the court for cause.

Trial May Last Two Weeks.

Prior to the adjournment of court, Mr. Heney said it would not take him longer than 20 minutes to present the opening statement of the case for the government. Probably a somewhat longer time will be required by the defense, so that it is expected the major part of the morning session today will be taken up in this way.

Forty Witnesses Here.

It was not announced yesterday by

Mr. Heney who will be the first witness for the government. However, about 40 residents of the eastern Oregon counties that were proposed to be incorporated in the Blue Mountain forest reserve have arrived in the city and are quartered at the different hotels.

In the Mays-Jones-Sorenson case, these witnesses testified chiefly as to the non-timbered character of the land within the boundaries of the proposed reserve.

It is supposed they will give the same testimony in the pending case.

Mays is in the city and probably will be one of the witnesses for the government. It is a reasonable certainty that George Sorenson will also testify for the prosecution.

Although Sorenson was convicted jointly with Mays and Jones in this same case, he has not been sentenced for the part he played in the conspiracy.

Henry Meldrum and Salmon B. Ormsby are among others connected with the land fraud prosecutions who have arrived in the city.

Ormsby was the agent for the government who investigated the proposed reserve and recommended to the interior department that it be established.

For his part in the scheme Ormsby is said to have received two quarter sections of school land, included within the reserve, as proposed which he disposed of for \$1,000 in cash.

Stubborn Fight Due.

When the large number of witnesses summoned by the government is taken into consideration, it appears altogether doubtful that it will be possible to conclude the trial within the fortnight predicted by Mr. Heney.

If anything, the Hermann trial will be fought more stubbornly than was the original hearing on this indictment, when the conviction of Mays, Jones and Sorenson was secured.

It would not be at all surprising if a month elapses before the case finally goes to the jury.
