HIGH MINDED ADMINISTRATION.

Stockmen's Association Endorse Pinchot's Forest Policies.

Denver, Colo., Jan. 12.—"The high minded and excellent" administration of Clifford Pinchot was endorsed in a resolution presented before the National Livestock association yesterday. The resolution demands a continuation of the Pinchot policies of administration of the forest reserves by his successor, and urges federal control of public grazing lands, with a lease law adequate to protect the cattlemen. Other resolutions introduced commended the work of the department of agriculture, condemned the "unfair discrimination" of the Payne tariff bill and the oleomargarine bill, urged the appointment of a non partisan tariff commission, and authorized a petition to the Interstate commerce commission to reduce terminal charges on livestock at Chicago.

In an address on railroad rates, S. H. Cowan, of Fort Worth, Tex., attacked the Interstate commerce court, recommended by President Taft, declaring that the law would be emasculated by turning over to the department of justice the defense of all cases brought against the decisions of the Interstate commerce commission.

James Callan, president of the Texas Cattle Raisers' association, urged the stockmen to break loose from party bonds and support those candidates pledged to the interests of the livestock industry.

Many governmental reforms are demanded in resolutions presented for adoption. Railroad rate legislation formed the basis of the morning discussion. The granting of power to the Interstate commerce commission to review classifications, to amend changes in regulations, and to institute proceedings on its own motion, as recommended by President Taft, are favored but the resolutions oppose the appointment of an interstate commerce court.

The Pinchot administration of the forest service is endorsed, and recommendations are made for a lease law governing the use of public lands for grazing. The resolutions also favor the continuation of the fight against free bid.

S. H. Cowan, of Fort Worth, Tex., discussed railroad rate legislation and the attitude of the government toward the railroads.

"The Future of the Livestock Industry in the Range Country" was the subject of an address by Joseph M. Carr, A. D. Melvin, chief of the bureau of animal industry of the department of agriculture, spoke on "Sanitary Conditions of Our Livestock," and Ima Tanimura, royal commissioner of livestock industry in Japan, discussed Japanese methods of stockraising.
