THREE BODIES
FOUND ON BEACH

(Special to The Evening News.)
MARSHFIELD, Ore., Jan. 29.—Three bodies from the wrecked steamer, Czarina, were found on the beach today a few miles north of where the wreck occurred. The bodies are badly decomposed and are unrecognizable. One of the bodies, however, is thought to be that of Captain Dugan, and another that of Harold Mills, son of C. J. Mills, of Marshfield. The other body is yet to be identified.

LOOT CZARINA BOXES.

Members of the Life Saving Crew Are Discharged.

Richard Christianson and J. S. Taylor, two of the members of the Coos Bay life saving crew, were suspended today by Captain Emory, inspector of this district, for 30 days. The cause of their suspension was the charge against them of looting boxes that had washed off the wrecked Czarina. Formal charges will be preferred against them soon.

This is the only result so far as known of the investigation that Capt. Emory had been quietly making of the Czarina wreck or rather of the actions of the life saving crew at the time of the disaster. It was reported this morning that Capt. Boles and a couple of other members of the crew had been suspended, but this is not correct.

Captain Emory's investigation was secret. So far as known, Captain Will Magee of the tug Astoria, was the only witness called besides the members of the life saving crew. Each witness was called up in private and his deposition taken. Just what evidence was deduced is not known and probably will not be, as it will be forwarded to headquarters by Captain Emory.

Coos Bay residents generally will probably insist on a more vigorous investigation of the affair than Captain Emory has made so far. They declare that only a complete investigation will satisfy them and give assurance that everything will be properly conducted in the future.

The Port of Coos Bay Commission has not yet received any replies to their requests of the government officials for an investigation of the affair.

Captain Will Magee is understood to be the principal witness against Messrs. Christianson and Taylor, the surf men, who were suspended today on the charge of looting. The alleged looting is said to have occurred the day of the disaster.

No more bodies from the wreck have been found. It was reported today that one of the sails from the wrecked vessel had been washed up on the beach near the mouth of Ten Mile creek.—Coos Bay Times.

WAITE TO GIVE \$5,000.

Judge J. S. Coke of the executive committee of the Marshfield Chamber of Commerce, which is securing the funds for the \$150,000 bonus for the completion of the Coos Bay & Boise line between here and Roseburg within two years, this morning received the following telegram from Frank Waite:

"Will subscribe five thousand dollars as per condition of contract. Marshfield should raise required amount in three hours under conditions of contract."

Mr. Waite is one of the first non-resident property owners to subscribe to the fund. Judge Coke has taken the matter up with all of them and other contributions are expected shortly.

Until the larger interests and non-resident property owners are secured, it is not the intention to make an active campaign among Coos Bay residents.—Coos Bay Times.
