Startling and almost unbellevable figures on the number of criminal homicides in America have been giv-en in an address by Dr. Andrew D. White, former president of Cornell mixeeralty. He asserts that the number of murders in the United States are forty-three times greater than in Canada and eight times greater than in Belgium, which has the largest number of any European than in Canda and eight three greater than in Belsium, which has the largest number of any European country; that in the United States the average criminal serves but sev-en years of a He sentence and but one nurder in seventy-four is pun-ished. The cause for this second provalence of crime, according to Dr. White, is the fact that the ad-ministration of criminal law in this country has become simuly a game played between clever lawyers.
