Seeks to Recover Timber Valued at \$5,400.

Suit for the recovery of timber valued at \$5,400 was begun yesterday by the United States District Attorney against George Neuner, residing near Roseburg. It is charged that Neuner-entered a homostead in 1903, but fulled to establish a residence on the land or in any manner cultivate it.

Soon after securing possession of the land Neuner is charged with having moved a portable sawn,ill onto the land and begun a systematic cutting of timber which was manufactured into lumber and disposed of on the local markets. The government enharges that out of 690,000 feet of boards secured by Neuner less than 9000 feet were utilized in improvements on the property.

Neuner relinquished the filling to the United States in January, 1307.


