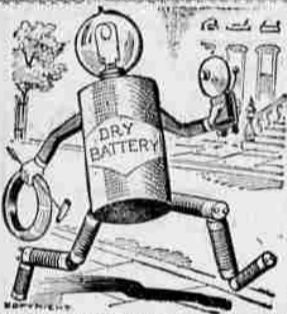

PRICE OF FLOUR DOWN.

Drops 40c Per Barrel at Seattle and Portland.

PORTLAND, March 17.—Cheer up. Things are going up and down these days, but the averages would seem to indicate that the high cost of living is on the down grade. The price of flour will be cut a flat 40 cents a barrel today, and in all probability butter will be marked down 3 cents a pound. Everybody knows that eggs have been working downward for two weeks. Potatoes are still cheap, and the same may be said of beans and onions.

Patent flour, the best in the market, which for a month has been selling at \$6.15 a barrel wholesale, will drop to \$5.75 a barrel today. The change here follows a cut of 40 cents which went into effect in the Sound markets Tuesday. Straights in the local market will be quoted at \$4.70 a barrel. The cut in retail prices will be proportionate.

On the other hand there is the discouraging announcement that the price of meat will be pushed up still a little further today. The packers gave out the report that quotations on all fresh meats would be readjusted and that the result would be an average advance of about a quarter of a cent a pound on all fresh meats, beef, pork and mutton.

In this connection further news of interest developed. Live hogs in the Portland market went to the unheard-of price of \$11.25 a hundred, all known record high prices of the past being left far behind, and at the same time it was reported that steers of the best quality actually sold at the local yards at \$6.50, an extraordinary price.
