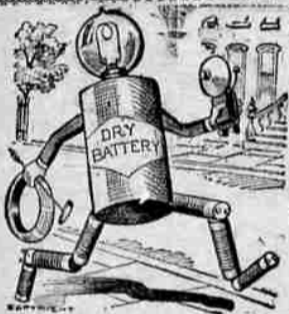

But Government Has Only 173 Farms to Give Away.

LOS ANGELES, March 21.—When the local land office ceased receiving applications for farms in the Yuma reclamation district Saturday afternoon, a line of applicants stretched the entire length of the Chamber of Commerce hall.

The crowd was a thermometer that showed most conclusively the desire of hundreds of homeseekers to take up land and it likewise gave a suggestion of the amount of disappointment that will follow the drawing to be held soon.

Sixteen hundred and ninety applications have been made for 173 farms, some of the plots being filed upon as many as 50 times each. There are a few of the farms that have not more than one applicant, and only those whose luck is good will be enabled to take possession of the coveted tracts.

While there will be private disputes as the result of the drawing, yet Uncle Sam's officers declare that they will not be interested further than to see that the drawing is conducted impartially.

There is little hope of a settlement, and the firemen will probably strike Tuesday.

WARMER SPRING THAN ORDINARY

WASHINGTON, D. C., March 21.—According to the weather bureau announcement spring begun today. Forecasts for the opening of the vernal season was generally a higher temperature throughout the country than for the same period last year.

E. N. Ewart, secretary of the Woodmen of the World Camp, No. 125, has just received a communication from the head camp enclosing \$3,000 in payment of the benefit certificate held by the late Amasa M. Sanders in the local camp. The check is made payable to Lulu Rogers, guardian of Everett G. Sanders.

One of the largest mortgages that has ever been recorded at the county clerk's office is being transferred to the mortgage records today by Deputy Agent. It consists of 21 sheets of closely typewritten matter, and is given to secure the payment of 15 promissory notes, eight of which are for \$25,000 each, and ten notes for \$5,000 each. The mortgage is given by the C. A. Smith Lumber and Manufacturing company to John W. Gary, trustee, of Minneapolis, Minn., and the mortgaged land lies in Douglas, Lincoln, Coos and Curry counties. The other mortgage was recorded about three years ago and was given by the Smith Timber company to the Central Trust company to secure the payment of three million dollars.
