Giving his opinion regarding the efficacy of newspaper advertising, the president of the National Biscuit company said: "Newspaper advertising we have found the best, taken all around. Billboards advertising is good, but it requires too much time and attention. The boards have to be watched to see that they are in good condition and the advertisements constantly renewed. We have very little trouble with the newspapers. Magazine advertising is well enough, but it is slow."

It seems that, judging from the statement of President Clark, of the proposed railway, for which a survey has already been made, that the ambitions of our people are soon to be realized. DIED.

At Mercy hospital, Tuesday, May 31, 1910, Franklin P. Hill, aged 24 years. Death was due to blood poisoning brought on by a gangrenous appendix and other afflictions.

Franklin P. Hill was born in Wilbur, Douglas county, Oregon, on July 23, 1885, and died at Mercy hospital May 31st, 1910, aged twenty-four years, ten months and eight days at date of death. The deceased young man is survived by a father and mother, Mr. and Mrs. W. G. Hill, of Wilbur, one sister, Mrs. O. C. Brown, of Dixonville, Oregon, and four brothers, R. C. Hill, of Drain, Oregon; Harry D. Hill and Carl Hill, of Wilbur, Oregon, and Benjamin F. Hill, of Reno Nevada.

The funeral was held at Wilbur today at 2:30 P. M., under the auspices of Rising Star Lodge, I. O. O. F. The forest service boys acted as honorary pall bearers, of which service the deceased was an active member. Church services were held at the Wilbur church by Rev. James K. Hawkins.

This young man had been sick only about two weeks. He was taken ill at Steamboat and brought to the home of his brother-in-law, O. C. Brown on Deer creek. The trip was a long, hard one and when he was placed in the Mercy hospital, very little hope was entertained for his recovery, but on account of his iron constitution, relatives and friends hoped for the best until the end.

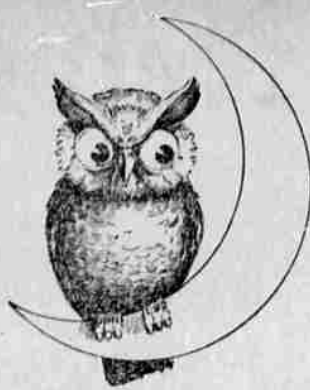

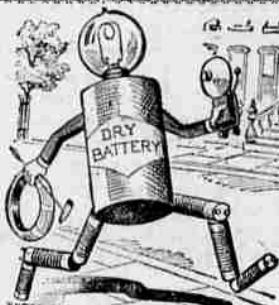
