WARNING TO FRUITGROWERS.

I would respectfully call your attention to the fire blight or pear blight which is causing so much damage to the fruit trees and for you to make a thorough and careful examination of your pear and apple trees and make a regular inspection of every tree in your orchard or on your place, and if any symptoms or indications exist to cut them out at once and sterilize the parts cut with a solution of corrosive sublimate, which you can get at any drug store. Dilute two tablets to four ounces of water and apply with sponge or cloth and burn all parts removed. Any fruit grower or any other persons knowing of any blight existing in any trees but their own will confer a favor by notifying me at once. This is very important and to your interest and should not be neglected.

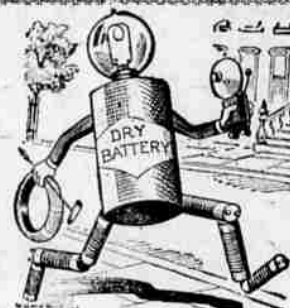
