NOTICE TO THE PUBLIC.

To whom it may concern:—Credits. Please read the following lines carefully and give them due consideration.

Beginning JULY FIRST, we will adopt the following rules from which we will make no exceptions.

First—ALL ACCOUNTS, excepting railroad employees accounts only, contracted during the month must be settled before the 10th day of the succeeding month.

Second—Railroad employees accounts must be settled before the 25th day of the succeeding month.

Third—All accounts will be closed on the 27th day of each month, and any purchases made thereafter will be charged on the next month's account.

Fourth—NO CREDIT will be extended to any person beyond the date herein set forth, whose accounts have not been settled within the specified time.

Our reasons for adopting the above are—

The manufacturers of the various lines we carry have shortened the terms of credit to the various jobbers to 10 days, and the jobbers in turn, have shortened the time of credit to us, from 30 days to 10 days.

Many people to whom we have extended credit, have been careless in settling their accounts at agreed time, necessitating our borrowing money to protect ourselves with our creditors.

To carry an account longer than thirty days, means that we must charge 10 per cent interest, which the trade would not care to pay.

We are your friend and consider you a friend, and as such, feel confident that you will co-operate with us as it is for our mutual benefit.

Any credit extended by us is according to above terms. Please do not ask for any other terms because we do not want to refuse you—which we will surely do—under any other conditions.

GOOD, STIFF SALARY.

Kaiser Gets \$22.50 Per Minute—Wealthy Fellow.

BERLIN, June 8.—Kaiser Wilhelm's income is computed to a nicety as the result of the discussion aroused by the proposal to increase the royal civic list. It is estimated that the income he derives from government sources amounts to 5,349 marks (\$1,335) an hour, or 88 marks (\$22.50) a minute. These figures came out in the course of furious attacks made by Socialists upon the bill in the Prussian Chamber of Deputies.

That the Kaiser is really a man of great wealth is supported by a number of other facts unearthed by opponents of the bill. He is owner of about 90 landed estates and 50 royal residences, including hunting boxes. Also, under an old law, he receives free, 40 riding horses each year, valued at about 120,000 marks (\$30,000.) The Crown Prince has a special income from separate sources.

Exceptional bitterness marked the debate on the civic list bill and one orator was called to order and charged with high treason by the president of the chamber.
