LOCAL NEWS.

H. Marks E. L. Parrott and J. D. Zacher were appointed appraisers of the estate of Chas. H. Bristol, insane. The papers which were filed with the county clerk on June 11, disclosed the fact that the estate consists of 51 acres of farm land in Douglas county, 38 acres of orchard in township 27 south, range 6 west, known as the Sunny Slope Farm, four houses together with a large number of farming implements, etc.

A message to the effect that fireman Eifer, employed by the S. P. and running out of this city was injured at Glendale was received at the dispatchers office early this morning. The message also stated that the fireman would be sent back to Roseburg on train No. 19, but did not state how badly he was injured. Consequently it left his friends in great suspense when it was learned that Eifer was not on the train when it arrived. He left this city on No. 15 at 4:20 A. M. According to the report he fell from the tank of engine 2203 as they were taking water at Glendale about sixty miles south of the city. It is thought very probable that he was slightly injured for otherwise he would have been sent back here on No. 15.

After being allowed \$400 by the county court in the October term in 1908 Leslie Lilly, secured a writ of review and according to the decision handed down by Circuit Judge J. W. Hamilton today he will now receive \$1,000 instead of \$400. When the new county road leading through Mr. Lilly's place on the North Empqua, about fifteen miles from the city was completed some time ago he asked that the old road should be vacated. This they refused to do and consequently is now paying \$1,000 for the privilege of holding the old road, even though it is very seldom used.

Roseburg will be able to boast of two more beautiful residences in the near future. How soon the new future will be depends upon the swiftness of Contractor B. S. Nichols' workmen, who are reputed to be fastest in the city. Postmaster C. W. Parks will be owner of one of the houses, which is to be a frame structure at the east end of Cass street and is to cost \$400. The other house is to be the residence of John Banks, a well known cattle man, of this city. It will be erected on Pine street, opposite the Christian church at a cost of \$2,000. Mr. Bank's house is to be one and one-half stories in height and is to be a bungalow in style, while Mr. Parks' new home will be two stories in height. Both homes will be a credit to the city when completed.
