

PUT OUT STATE TICKET.

Dry Farcis Will be Laid up in Campaign.

Prohibitionists of Oregon yesterday concluded a two days' session at the Y. M. C. A. auditorium with the nomination of a state ticket. Not having polled 25 per cent of the votes cast for Congressman at the last election, the Prohibitionists are not bound by all of the terms of the primary law of Oregon, and it is probable that the Secretary of State will certify their nominations on the official ballot for the fall election without other formality. But the prohibition state committee will take no chances in the year 1910, when the leaders predict such a sweeping of sentiment for state wide prohibition, and have decided to get out a nominating petition in addition.

The nominations were greeted with the wildest enthusiasm, especially the name of the standard-bearer at the head of the fight, A. E. Eaton. Mr. Eaton is an influential citizen of Eastern Oregon, described as a Daniel Webster on the stump, and having acquiring merit by presenting the Willamette University with a \$50,000 building N. A. Davis, of Umatilla, and bankers.

Leslie Butler, of Hood River, are the campaign will be in charge of a state central committee, of which J. P. Newell was elected chairman, W. E. Critchlow, secretary and B. Lee Paget, treasurer. The state central committee is not confined to counties, but is made up of party members in various towns of the state.

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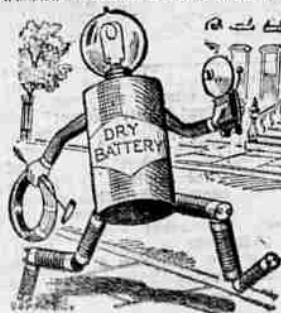
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
